# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Have you ever had a bad church experience? If so, to what extent was it caused by the church prioritizing the Bible or the law over you or other people?
- 2. Why is it so tempting to think of faith as obeying God's rules rather than living in a growing relationship with him?
- 3. Read Mark 13:1-4. Before Andy's message, how aware were you of Jesus' prediction that the Temple would be destroyed? What was your reaction to that part of the message?
- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 6:19. If following Jesus isn't about rule-keeping, what does it mean for you to live as though your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit? What is required of you?
- 5. During the message, Andy said, "With the arrival of Jesus, sacred has been commuted. There are no more sacred sites, objects, or geography. There are only sacred individuals. You're seated next to, married to, or raising a sacred person." In what ways should that idea influence how you express your faith in the way you treat others?
- 6. What is one thing you can do this week to take a first step or a new step toward following Jesus? How can this group support you?
